First international preparatory meeting for COP21 in Paris

Aims, agenda and logistics for this meeting

The aim of this 1st international meeting to prepare civil society actions around COP21 in 2015 is to both:

- Prepare the local, national and international mobilization for COP21. The point of the meeting is not to spend too much time analyzing the negotiations but focus to on the frameworks and spaces, messages and tools that we need to amplify the mobilization and make as much noise as possible.
- Prepare COP21 mobilization in light of the mobilization for the Ban Ki Moon summit, the People's Summit in Lima at COP20 and all the other actions planned throughout 2015 and beyond.

These contributions will be compiled and sent to all the participants registered for the meeting so that they can come prepared and informed.

After the meeting in Paris on the August 23rd and 24th, we will meet again in New York, Venezuela and Lima in 2014, and we will discuss the next steps and meetings required in 2015. In addition to the meetings we can organize during the UNFCCC negotiations and other international meetings like the World Social Forum in Tunis (March 24-28, 2015), the French coalition believes two specific meetings will be required in 2015 - one international meeting early June, in Paris, before the Bonn session, and one European-focused meeting in the Fall season, before COP21. We can discuss this further on the 23rd and 24th of August.
